

Ballots sent out for special school levy WCCC receives monies from GWEB

The County Clerk is sending out ballots to the post office July 22 for the special school district operating levy.

Measure number 1 asks: shall the Morrow County school district levy \$202,916 in 1988-89 in excess of the

amount levied for operating purposes in 1987-88 and outside its tax base?

Irrigon voters will also vote on measure no. 2 which asks: shall the City of Irrigon, Morrow County, Oregon, levy \$146,474 outside the tax base for operating purposes?

When asked about the levy, Doyle McCaslin, School Superintendent stressed that "it is vitally important for the programs of the Morrow County School district and the financial future of the district to get this levy passed." He went on to say "if the levy is not passed, it will have a crucial effect on all of our schools."

If you have not received your ballot a few days after the July 22 mailing, contact the County Clerk. If you are properly registered, there are provisions for replacement ballots. The ballots are to be back in the clerk's office by 8 p.m. August 9.

The Morrow County Soil and Water Conservation board requested monies from the "Governor's Watershed Enhancement Board" (GWEB) to be used, along with matching funds from the golf club, to put in streambank riprap for the prevention of erosion. The SWCD applied for the funds with a specific project in mind, which was the stream banks. Forty six districts applied for \$46,000 and each received \$1,000, with the stipulation that they have a project in mind.

In the 1930's, the CCC (Civilian

Conservation Corps) put in check dams during the Roosevelt administration. Three of these dams are on Willow Creek Golf club property. These dams were installed by people that didn't have jobs to give them an opportunity to earn money. These are in need of repair, along with the stream banks.

The club members will be doing the work on the stream banks and hopefully they will start this fall when the water level is lower, says Charlie Rawlins, board representative.
