Thursday starts nine days of intense preparation for the big game at Baker's High School Stadium. A great deal must be learned in a short period of time. Players from high

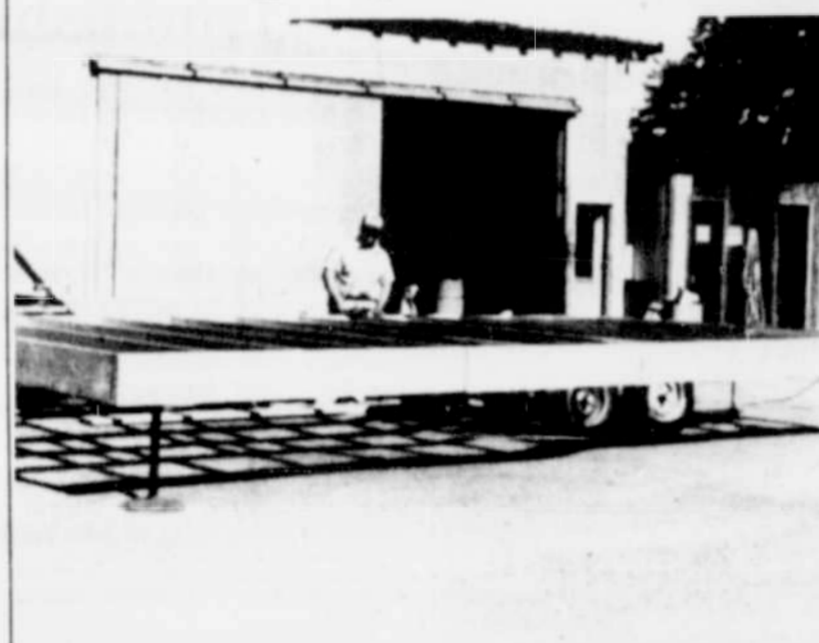
schools all over the state must learn different terminology, new plays, and new offensive and defensive signals. They also must learn to work with new team mates they have just met to form solid football teams.

### School Board News

The Morrow County school board met July 18 at A. C. Houghton.

The board elected Dwayne Carroll chairman and Bill Doherty vice-chairman for 1988-89.

Bids were accepted for re-roofing Heppner High School, Lone Elementary and Sam Boardman Elementary School.

Action on the bid for replacing the Lone Elementary School gym floor was tabled.

In other business the board designated the superintendent and deputy clerk, purchasing and investment coordinator, and all principals.

Set the borrowing limit at \$250,000 for 1988-89.

Designated the Heppner Gazette Times as newspaper of record for 1988-89.

Accepted resignations from Terri Franks, Kevin Egan, and resignation of Jocelyn Jones as position as head girls basketball coach in Lone; hired Michelle Warburton as math/computer teacher in Heppner; hired Rod Benson as science/physical education teacher in Heppner; hired Sara Eurich as temporary teacher at Lone; hired Jennifer Byron as temporary sixth grade teacher at A.C. Houghton; hired Marilyn Ralph as secretary at A.C. Houghton; and approved extended responsibility contract for John Adamson to lead band at Riverside High School.

The board heard that the district has seven teaching positions and one classified position left to fill before school starts.

Under unfinished business, the board approved bids from Devin Oil for gasoline, vehicle diesel and furnace diesel for 1988-89; approved Heppner Nor Gas for propane; McCall Oil Company for P.S. 300 furnace oil.

The board appointed Clint Krebs and Mark Lovgren to the budget committee.
