Plaintiffs allege:

1. At all times material herein, plaintiffs were and now are husband and wife, residing in the State of Oregon.

2. At all times hereinafter mentioned, defendants were husband and wife and may be found in Umatilla County, Oregon.

3. On the 17th day of April, 1986, for good and valuable consideration, defendants made, executed, and delivered to plaintiffs their promissory note, a true copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference. Ever since, plaintiffs have been and now are the sole owners and holders of that note.

4. Pursuant to the terms of the promissory note, defendants promised to pay plaintiff the sum of \$3,008.22 in consecutive monthly installments of \$119.77 beginning on the 26th day of May, 1986, until paid.

5. Defendants are in default on the note by reason of their failure to make the payments required thereunder, and plaintiffs have declared the entire unpaid balance of the note, \$2,117.73, immediately due and payable.
