## Plan ahead-learn changes before canning

The major change involves the use of pressure saucepans, the specialist said, which are no longer recommended for use in home canning.

Other changes involve the kinds of jars recommended, instructions about proper sterilization of canning jars, and new information about adjusting time and pressure for altitude changes.

Some products for which times are changed include asparagus and white potatoes. Peel the potatoes before canning.

Vegetables canned in previous years are safe to use, providing they were properly processed, Raab said. Of course jars should be checked for spoilage first. Boil for 10 minutes to provide an extra margin safety, she adds.

However, Raab says, there are new recommendations for disposal of spoiled low-acid foods. Before discarding, detoxify the spoiled food by removing the lid and then placing the jar, its contents, and the loose lid in hot water deep enough to cover the jar. Boil all items for 30 minutes. Cool and then discard in garbage can or bury in soil. This should prevent any chance of accidental poisoning.

One of the ways to prepare for the 1988 canning season is to discard old reference materials, Raab adds. Obtain current information from the OSU Extension Service or, if buying a commercial canning book, look for books with 1988 dates or which indicate that the contents include the new recommendations.

Now's the time to get equipment ready and review new procedures for canning vegetables at home, points out Carolyn Raab, Oregon State University Extension foods and nutrition specialist.

"There are several changes in recommended ways to can vegetables at home this year," Raab notes, "you'll want to have time to review the procedures and to get your canning equipment and supplies in order before harvest time."

County offices of the OSU Extension Service are receiving up-dated information about the new U.S. Department of Agriculture recommendations and will be able to answer questions, the specialist said.

"Of course, the basic recommendation to can low-acid foods, such as green beans, under pressure has not changed," she observed. "However, preservers will notice different times for some products and an even greater emphasis on having pressure canning equipment in good working order."

For instance, there are different processing instructions for canners with weighted gauges and canners with dial gauges. The new recommendations assure that heat treatment is the same for in both types of canners.

It's important that preservers have dial gauges checked annually to insure accuracy, Raab stresses. Morrow County Extension office has the equipment to check your canner.

## Give your smoke alarm a birthday

Smoke detectors protect us from household fires, but they can also serve as a safety reminder for our children.

Smoke alarms are now required by law in many jurisdictions, but they won't work unless they have a fresh battery about once a year.

One suggestion is to give the smoke detector a birthday present. In families with young children the detector's birthday can coincide with the child's. This helps adults remember when to change the battery, but it also gives parents a good opportunity to offer their children a brief but poignant fire safety lesson.
