## Fire restrictions in effect

Umatilla National Forest Supervisor Jim Lawrence announced that a restriction on campfires and other open fires went into effect at 12:01 a.m., Friday, August 12. The restriction prohibits building and tending fires until further notice, except within designated wilderness and in fireplaces at designated recreation sites, on the Umatilla National Forest.

Permissible sources of heat include enclosed wood stoves, portable metal base charcoal grills and gas stoves. The restriction applies to all National Forest lands, roads and trails administered by the Heppner, North Fork John Day, Walla Walla and Pomeroy Districts of the Umatilla National Forest.

Campers are cautioned to be extremely careful when using fires in the following wilderness areas and designated recreation sites: Heppner Ranger District Campgrounds, Penland Lake, Bull Prairie and Fairview.
