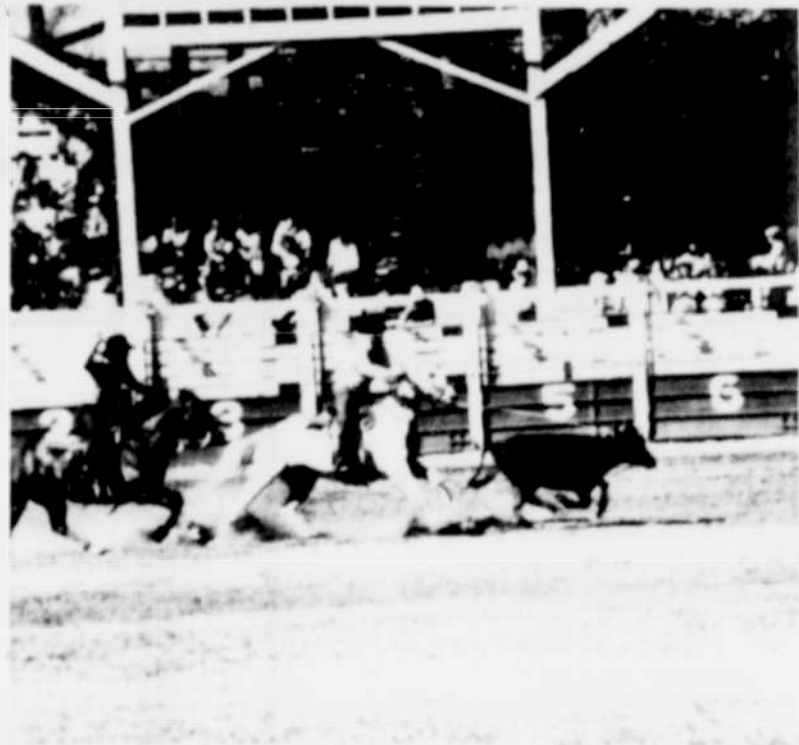
Her favorite rodeo, she says is Heppner because she knows everyone. She is also looking forward to attending the Walla Walla Night Rodeo.
