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Cake contest is popular

The Oregon Wheat Growers League has a cake baking contest again this year. This year's cake is called the Sunny Sour Cream Cake.

Each year the OWGL publishes a new recipe for a cake using soft white wheat in the ingredients. This year's recipe is: 1 cup butter, 2 cups sugar, 4 eggs, 1 tablespoon lemon juice, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 3 cups sifted cake flour, ¼ teaspoon soda, ½ teaspoon salt, ¾ cup sour cream.

Heat oven to 325 degrees. Grease and flour 10" by 4" Bundt pan. Beat sugar and butter in large bowl on medium speed until light and fluffy, beat in eggs, one at a time. Mix flour, baking soda and salt; beat into sugar mixture alternately with sour cream until well blended. Do not overmix. Stir in lemon juice and vanilla. Spread in prepared pan. Bake until wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean, about one hour. Invert pan on wire rack; remove from pan.

Contestants have to use this recipe. Bring the cake to the fair on Wednesday, August 17, at 8 a.m., on a covered board. You can take most of it home after judging, leaving about a quarter of it for display.

Any county resident over 18 is eligible except for professional bakers.

In keeping with the theme of the Fair, we would especially like to have entries of any flowers that have been in the area since early times. There is a "Cabbage" rose in Lexington that has been growing here for nearly 100 years which we hope to exhibit. Put the history of the entry on a 3x5 or 4x6 card.

Flower arrangers may use a back drape to display their entries, about 27" high and as wide as their exhibit. Lots 1, 2, 5, and 6 won't use a back drop.

Flower preservative will be used again this year. You may pick up bottles, your entry tags, premium

sheet and exhibitor number on Monday, Aug. 15, between one and six p.m., so you can complete your entries at home. This will lessen the congestion Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning.

Entries must be complete and inside on the entry tables by the stated entry time of 10 a.m. Wednesday. Absolutely no entries will be accepted after that time.

The Arrangement Contest is Friday as stated in the Schedule.

Don't forget your canning

The canning season is upon us. During the hot summer days, as you are putting up apricot preserves, or canning sweet pickles, set a jar aside for the fair. The more entries there are, the better the fair will be.

For canned foods, one jar per entry is allowed and all entries must be canned in standard jars with rings, including jams and jellies. In addition, jellies must be in glass which can be unmolded.

The jars need to be labeled with the contents name and the method and date of processing. Meats and vegetables have to be pressure canned.

Dried vegetables, fruits and fruit leather may be entered, also.

If you're baking a pie around fair time, bake two instead and bring one to fair. Pies, cakes, breads cookies - all are welcome. "Everyone can bake so bake something and enter it just for fun. You might win, and that's exciting," says Joyce Hughes, superintendent of foods. "If there isn't a specific category listed for the item you want to bring, one will be created."

So bring some food to fair, whether canned, dried, or prepared. Make that favorite recipe that was handed down from great grandma and win a blue ribbon.

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
