

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's department at the courthouse in Heppner reports dispatching the following business during the past week:

COMPLAINT - BREACH OF INSTALLMENT NOTE
Plaintiffs allege:

1 At all times material herein, plaintiffs were and now are husband and wife, residing in the State of Oregon.

2 At all times hereinafter mentioned, defendants were husband and wife and may be found in Umatilla County, Oregon.

3 On the 17th day of April, 1986, for good and valuable consideration, defendants made, executed, and delivered to plaintiffs their promissory note, a true copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference. Ever since, plaintiffs have been and now are the sole owners and holders of that note.

4 Pursuant to the terms of the promissory note, defendants promised to pay plaintiff the sum of \$3,008.22 in consecutive monthly installments of \$119.77 beginning on the 26th day of May, 1986, until paid.

5 Defendants are in default on the note by reason of their failure to make the payments required thereunder, and plaintiffs have declared the entire unpaid balance of the note, \$2,117.73, immediately due and payable.

6 Despite demands for the balance owing, defendants have failed or refused to pay the balance owing on the note. As a result there is now due and owing on the note from defendants to plaintiffs the sum of \$2,117.73, together with interest thereon at 14% annum from the 29th day of June, 1988 until paid.

7 The note further provides that in the event suit or action is filed to collect the note, defendants agreed also to pay plaintiffs reasonable attorney fees. Plaintiff has been required to obtain the services of an attorney to enforce this note.

WHEREFORE, plaintiffs pray for judgement against defendants and each of them in the amount of \$2,117.73, together with interest thereon at the rate of 14% annum from the 29th day of June, 1988, until paid, for plaintiff's reasonable attorney fee, and for plaintiff's costs and disbursements incurred herein.

On May 20, 1988, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Fay P. Page for approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Willow Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 57261 State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Fay P. (Riddle) Page, describes a right for the use of not to exceed 0.100 cubic foot per second from Willow Creek, for irrigation of 1.20 ac NW1/4 SE1/4 and 4.70 ac NW1/4 SE1/4, Sec 2, T3S, R27E, WM, with a date of priority of December 20, 1982.

Water for said right is diverted from a point located 240's & 230'E from the NW corner of Sec 12, being within the NW1/4 NW1/4 of Sec 12, T3S, R27E, WM.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the point of diversion of water therefrom to a point located 1780'N & 290'E of S1/4 corner of Sec 2, being within the NW1/4 SE1/4 of Sec 2, T 3S, R27E, W.M.

Protests against approval of the application may be filed by persons alleging injury to their existing water rights. Protests must be prepared in writing: one copy to be served on the applicant at PO Box 512, Heppner, OR 97836; and one copy filed in the office of the Water Resources Director, Salem, OR 97310, together with a \$25 filing fee. Forms and rules for filing protests will be furnished upon request. If a protest is filed, a hearing will be scheduled.

IF NO PROTEST IS FILED, THE APPLICATION MAY BE APPROVED BY THE WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR WITHOUT A HEARING, BUT NOT BEFORE 20 DAYS AFTER THE LAST PUBLICATION OF THIS NOTICE.
