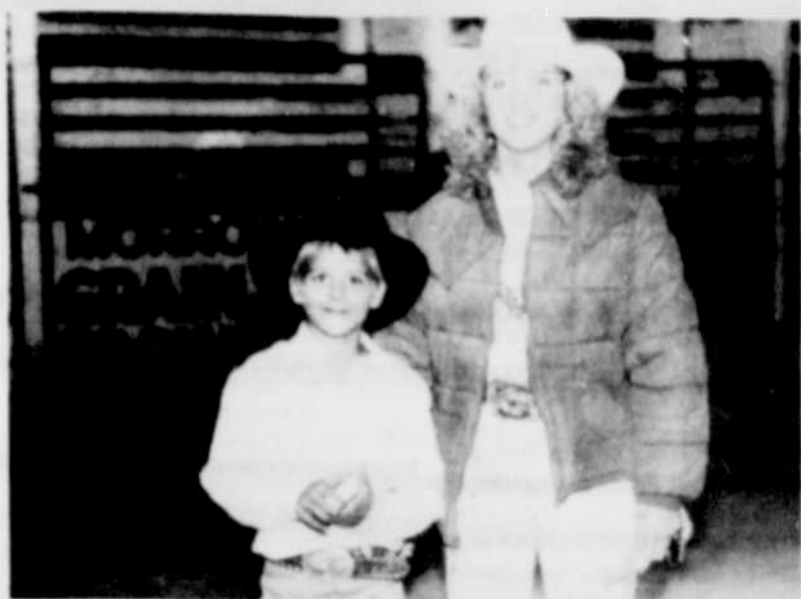


Many take home rodeo awards



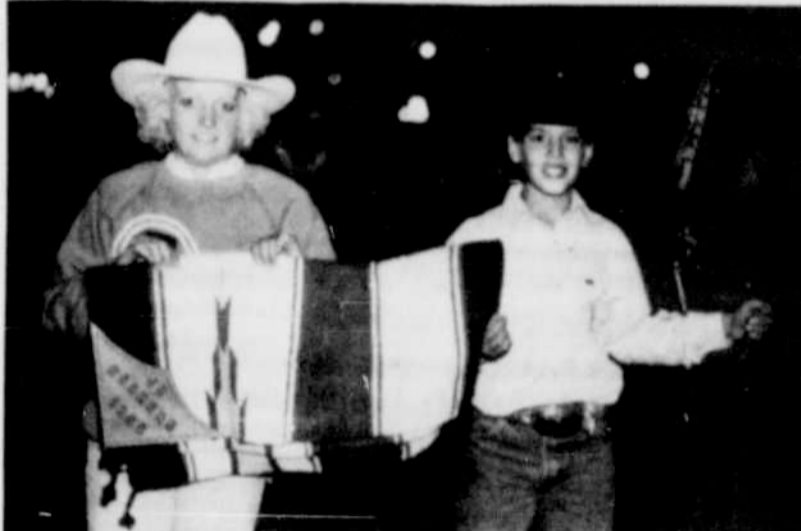
Troy Johnson was presented a buckle donated by the Gazette-Times for winning first in mutton busting. Queen Missy presents the award.

Jade Marston was second in the mutton busting. Her buckle was donated by the Gazette-Times and presented by Queen Missy.



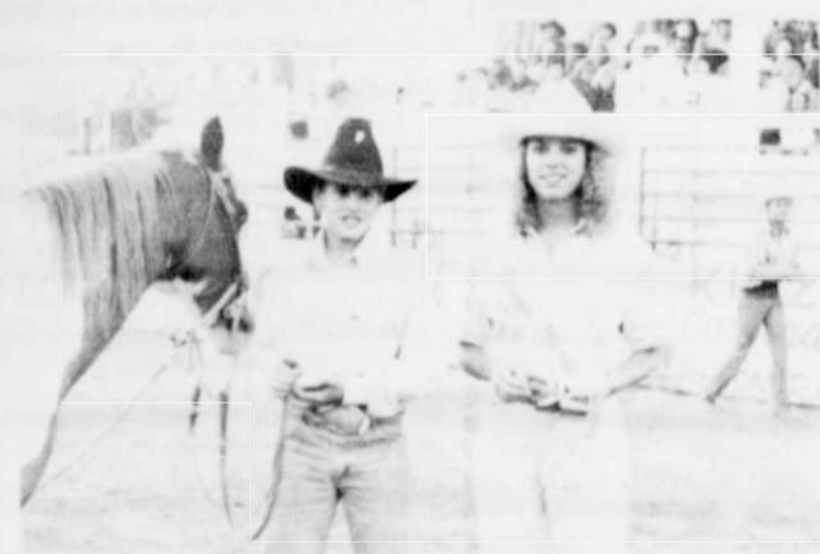

SWIMMING POOL INFO....

Heppner Municipal Swimming Pool will have a public swim on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30 to 5:00 p.m., September 1 through September 22, 1988. Admission - .50 per person.

An advanced lifesaving course will be offered. Requirements are:

- Must be 15 years old or older.
- Must be able to swim 500 yards continuously.
- Must be able to perform a pike, tuck and feet first surface dive.
- Must be able to tread water one minute.
- Must be able to perform a standing front dive and swim 20 feet under water.

This is a 20 hour course. Classes will be held from 6 to 8 p.m. on September 1, 6, 7, 8, 12, 13, 14, and 19. Two Saturday or Sunday classes to be determined by group. Test will be held on Sept. 20. Limited to 15 persons.

Fee is \$5.00 per person plus cost of book. (Approx. \$5 for book). Instructor will be Jean Strange.
