

HS volleyball looking for competitive season

The Heppner High School Volleyball team is looking forward to a very exciting and competitive season. Under third year head coach Terri Gentry and assistant Pam Dowdy, practice opened August 22 with 23 girls. Now these players have been divided into three teams (Varsity, Junior Varsity and 'C' Team) of about 9 players each.

The varsity is returning 7 seniors. These include Christy Stroeber, Jill Conklin, Tami Lindsay, Nance Wright, Sandi Turner, Michelle Wallis, and Tracey Bond. Junior Joanna Welch and sophomore Nikki Brisbois will also see action in varsity uniforms. Although this is a fairly small squad, it has depth and experience.

Returning setters, Wallis and Stroeber, already know the 6-2 offense that will be used, so they will be put to the test this season. Six-foot Lindsay and 5'10" Turner will anchor the offense in the front row with their hitting and blocking abilities. Wright, Conklin, and Bond will add

more experience and leadership with 3 years of volleyball behind them. Welch and Brisbois are strong players and should complement the team nicely. With all this experience, the Fillies hope to return to the District Tournament after a 3 year absence. "We should do very well in league play this year, which will hopefully result in a district championship," stated Gentry. The Fillies will open the season at the Grant Union Tournament on September 10 at 10 a.m. Their league opener is September 22 against Wahtonka in The Dalles.

The junior varsity should do well this year with juniors, Kelly McLaughlin, Jenny Martin, Dulcie Palmer; sophomores, Amy Greenup, Jenni Weygandt, and Melanie Gates. Varsity floaters, Brisbois and Welch, and 'C' team floaters Mary VanBibber (junior) and Kristi O'Brien (sophomore).

The rest of the 'C' team is composed of freshmen; Amy Brownfield, Kim Johnston, Heather Eckman, Sheryl Conklin, Christy Corwin and Nina Tucker.
