The Irrigon Early Learning Center is growing.
Enrollment is up, according to Director, Dee Warren. The center opened its doors August 29 for the 1988-89 school year.
"We are working with the Foster Grandparent Program," said Warren. "We would like more adult coverage for our growing enrollment."
Pre-school sessions are taught alternately by Mari Gordanier and Melodee Tovey.

Three year-olds attend from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Tuesday and Thursday. Morning or afternoon sessions are available Monday, Wednesday and Friday for four year-olds.

Day care begins at 6 a.m. and goes to 6 p.m. Breakfast, lunch and snacks are provided.

The Latch Key program is stressed by Warren. "We would rather see the children come here than go home alone," she said.

The Latch Key program includes

activities such as crafts, tennis and various gym exercises.
"Donations of such things as toys and puzzles would be appreciated," said Warren.

Fees will be reduced to parents who volunteer their time to help at the Early Learning Center.

An eighteen-year-old Riverside graduate will be running for the Irrigon City council come November.

Carl Judd of Irrigon will be the youngest person in the history of Irrigon to run for such an office.

"I felt they needed some youth on the council," said Carl. "Besides, I feel I'd make a good councilman."

"I plan on representing the people," said Carl. "That is the purpose of the City Council."

"All aspects of the community should be represented in city government," he added.

Carl is a qualified candidate. He is of qualifying age, he is a registered voter within the Irrigon City limits, and he has lived in the community for over one year.

A petition was circulated asking that Carl be placed on the November

2 ballot. Twenty verified signatures are needed to qualify. Carl received forty-five.

How does the mayor feel about someone so young possibly helping to run the city? "I like to have young people take an interest in the community," said Irrigon Mayor, Don Eppenbach.

"We need all the assistance we can get from our youth," he added.

Carl was chapter officer in the Future Farmers of America (FFA) for 3 years. He served as president of FFA his senior year of high school.

Carl's aim in life is to "be a success."

Carl plans to work for a year, then attend Blue Mountain Community College. His major will be agriculture business management.

Carrot oil gives flamingos color

In captivity, flamingos are fed carrot oil to keep their feathers pink. Carrot oil contains carotin, a chemical that gives the flamingo's annual growth of new feathers pink color. Without this chemical the bird's feathers would be white. In the wild, a flamingo's pink color comes from the carotin in the tiny shrimp-like animals they eat.
