



There are several strategies for dealing with the Russian Wheat Aphid (RWA), and all of them work to some extent but the best strategy is prevention.

Colorado has had RWA's for 2 years now and has gained some insight for dealing with them.

This week I had the opportunity to visit with a Colorado agent.

"Control the volunteer wheat", he said. "The farmer with clean fields is less likely to have infestations than producers who have a lot of volunteer wheat."

This makes sense. We have had six sightings so far this fall. Volunteer wheat produces a perfect environment and perfect location to cause infestation in fields.

Simply rod weeding the volunteer a few days before seeding will not clear up the problem. There has to be sufficient time for the volunteer to die and the aphid to either die or migrate before seeding. I think two weeks is long enough.

And, of course, a clean field is no guarantee against an infestation. One needs to be constantly watching his fields for signs of the aphid.

Call the Extension office if you spot the RWA in your field and call us again if you treat the field. They are mapping the movement and publishing results in Agri-Times and East Oregonian.

State rep. candidate tours Cutsforth park

Mike Nelson, candidate for State Representative, toured Cutsforth Park on Wednesday, September 14. Nelson wrapped up a three day visit to Morrow County on Wednesday, visiting the Heppner Senior Center, meeting with employees at the Kinzua Mill, and meeting with local business leaders.

Earl and Charlene Papineau, the park's managers, showed Nelson the park and its facilities. Nelson complimented the park and the Papineaus, and said that the county has done a good job promoting the park.

"The situation at Cutsforth Park is a good example of an opportunity for state and local governments to work together," Nelson said. "Our lottery dollars are earmarked for economic development, and that includes promoting tourist attractions. It's only fair that Morrow County should get more of those funds than it now

receives." Nelson gave some examples of promotions for Morrow County such as a well promoted and much improved "scenic loop" through Ione and over the mountains along Highway 74.

"As I see it," Nelson said, "securing those dollars is the job of our representative and senator. If the money is there, and believe me it is, I see no reason not to go after it and bring it home. If the people of Morrow County want a scenic loop to bring in tourist dollars, then there is no reason not to go after the money for road improvement and tourism promotion."

Nelson, now campaigning for State Representative in Morrow, Grant, Baker, and Crook counties, sat on Governor Goldschmidt's Transition Council, and helped build the Economic Development Department, which controls the revenues brought in by the lottery.

"I know how that department works, and I know how to push requests through there. Most people aren't familiar with that process, and they are the ones who are consistently being left out in the cold," he stated. "Morrow County has a shot at those dollars, and it's time to take advantage of that."

Morrow County invites bids for the Paul Smith Road Improvements - 1988. The work will be bid in two separate bid schedules. Contractors may bid on one or both bid schedules.

The Schedule "A" work consists of irrigation piping installation. Bid Schedule "A" will include approximately 660 feet of 24-inch C.M.P. which will be installed in an existing concrete channel and the supply and placement of approximately 55 cubic yards of bedding material and approximately 140 cubic yards of general backfill. The work also includes reinforced concrete modification work on existing headwalls associated with the pipe installation work and the widening of an existing irrigation channel road crossing. Schedule "A" work is planned for the fall of 1988.

The Schedule "B" work consists of supplying and placing approximately 600 cubic yards of crushed base rock and shoulder rock, and approximately 7,700 square yards of asphalt concrete pavement, 2 inches thick. The work also includes approximately 730 linear feet of extruded asphalt concrete curb. The Schedule "B" work is planned for the spring of 1989.

Morrow County forces will construct roadway grade, install gabions, retaining structures, and construct roadway base between the time of the Schedule A work and the Schedule B work.

Sealed bids for the described project will be received by the Morrow County Public Works Department at the Morrow County Public Works office in Lexington, Oregon until 1:00 p.m., Pacific Time, October 17, 1988, and then publicly opened and read aloud. No bid will be considered unless it contains a statement by the bidder that ORS 279.350 (Prevailing Wage Law and Prevailing Wage Rates) will be complied with.
