Wheat growers to meet for fall workshop

Wheat growers from across Oregon will be meeting at their annual Fall Workshop to "start the Oregon Wheat Growers League grass roots process," announced Don Peterson, lone wheat farmer and president of the Oregon Wheat Growers League.

The OWGL Fall Workshop will be held Wednesday, October 19. The location is the Red Lion/Indian Hills in Pendleton. The meeting will start at 9 a.m. and adjournment is planned for 4:30 p.m.

"All wheat grower committees, both the state and county level have been requested to attend the meeting," said Peterson. "The purpose is to stimulate ideas on how we can improve our economic condition and to give some direction for discussion at the various county meetings to be held this fall."

An informational meeting will be held in the morning at this annual Fall Workshop, said Peterson.

"We want each committee to develop three issues of primary concern," said Peterson. "These issues will then be presented to the county meetings where the county OWGL organizations will then present their views at the annual convention."

Peterson stressed that the OWGL "resolution development system depends strongly on the grass roots input from the individual farmers."

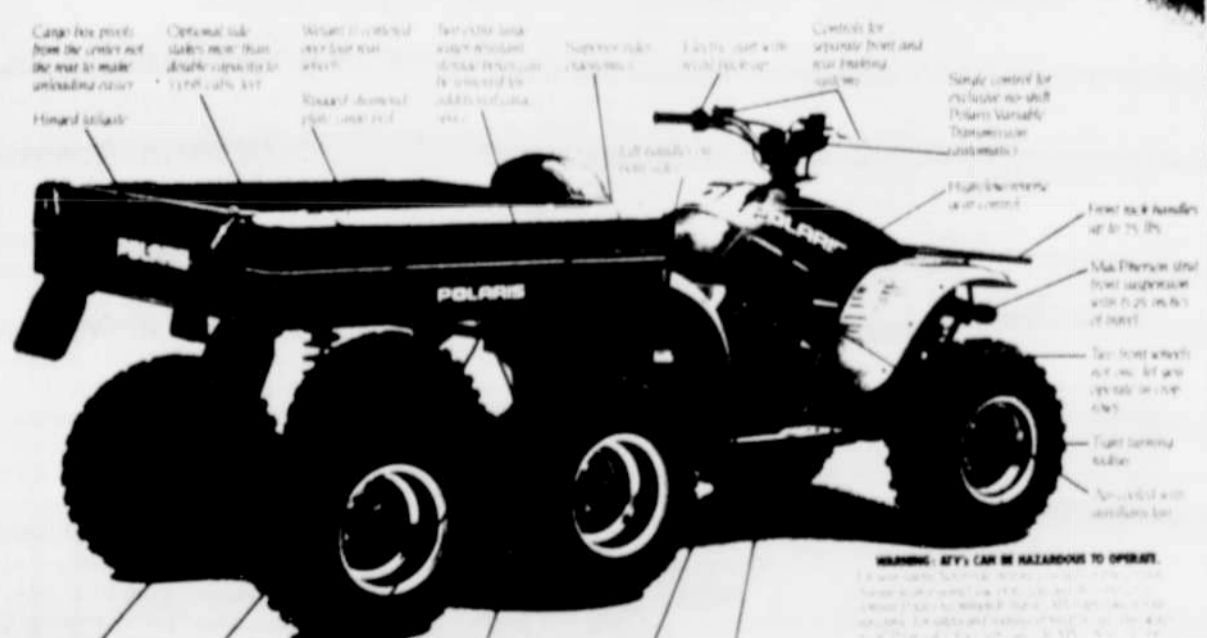
Bill Hulse, Wasco County judge, opened the session with a welcome to The Dalles.
