Britt carried the ball 15 times for

95 yards which is an average of 6.3 yards a carry. Britt also had one pass reception for four yards. The offensive line played one of their best games, opening holes for our backs and controlling the line-of-scrimmage.

Defensive line up includes seniors, Barney Lindsay, Mike Mahoney, Jess Osmin, Jerry Brosnan, Ted Schwartz, Jim Brosnan, Steve Arbogast, Brian Kollman, Bryan Padberg, Craig Angell, Dick Devin, Juniors Ryan Miller, Dean Munkers, Russell Britt and sophomore Al Burt.

Special notes go to Mahoney and Miller for their defensive End play which kept pressure on the Umatilla quarterback all day. Britt and Osmin also receive special recognition for their interception returns for touchdowns that sealed the game for us. Another special note goes to the person who makes our defensive calls, coach Les Payne. This win was a total defensive team win, holding Umatilla who was averaging 380 yards a game to 120 yards.

Mustangs win over Vikings — first time in 7 years

The Heppner Mustangs traveled to Umatilla last Friday to take on the Vikings at their own homecoming. The game was long and rough, but the Mustangs won 20-6. This is the first time the Mustangs have beat the Vikings in 7 years. "The offensive line knew it was going to be a challenge and they did the job. They controlled the line of scrimmage from the start to finish," said coach Birkby.

The Mustangs scored first when Heppner marched 58 yards and Dick Devin jumped it in the end zone on a quarterback sneak on the 2 yard line, but in the second quarter the Vikings had a 30 yard drive to score on a quarterback sneak by Travis Turner, but the pass was no good to make the score 7-6.

In the third quarter neither team scored, but in the fourth quarter with three minutes left in the game the Vikings started a powerful drive down field, but was broken up when seniors Mike Mahoney and Steve Arbogast and junior Ryan Miller all sacked the quarterback for a loss of 11 yards. On the next play with 1:30 seconds on the clock, senior noseguard Jess Osmin intercepted a middle screen pass and ran it back 57 yards for the winning touchdown. On the next offensive play for

Umatilla Russell Britt intercepted a pass to run it back 37 yards for another touchdown. Osmin and Britt lead the Mustangs on defense with 23 points apiece including an interception and a touchdown apiece. Osmin also had a fumble recovery, one unassisted tackle, and seven assisted tackles. Britt had three unassisted tackles and seven assisted tackles. Dick Devin had 21 defensive points and Mahoney had 11 points including two quarterback sacks. "This was the most complete game our defense played all year. It was a total team effort on defense," said coach Birkby.

Offensively, the Mustangs played as a team just as well. Jim Brosnan ran for 45 yards on 12 carries and Britt ran for 95 yards on 15 carries. Receiving the ball, Craig Angell had three catches for 40 yards and Mike

Correa had two catches for 14 yards.

The Mustangs play at home Friday, Oct. 28, when they host the Wahtonka Eagles at the Mustang's homecoming. The game starts at 7:30 p.m.
