The third quarter opened with a McBride pass run which led to an 8 yard touchdown, again, by Holtz. Culver counter-attacked with another touchdown.

Quarterback Sean Warren had a 26 yard run followed by a 9 yard touchdown by sophomore Jim Holtz; answered by yet another touchdown by the 'end zone hungry' Bulldogs. The third quarter ended with a score of lone 24, Culver 64.

McBride, having his best game of the season, finally scored with a 15 yard pass run for his first touchdown. lone scored next, beating Culver in the tug-of-war of touchdowns with Holtz running for his fifth touchdown of the game for 8 yards.

Culver scored the last time ending the score at lone 40, Culver 70.

Holtz and McBride were praised on their game. Holtz ended the game with 102 yards rushing and five touchdowns. McBride had six pass receptions for 162 yards and one touchdown. Rob Wilson ended the game in the second quarter with an ankle injury. Shawn Hams led the Cards in tackles with 12.

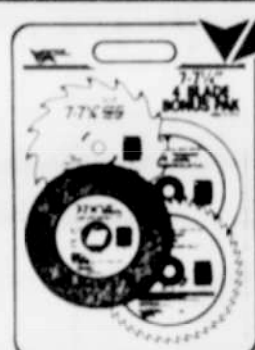
