## United Way receives request for \$29,000

United Way of Morrow County has received requests totalling \$29,000 this year. This is almost double the amount requested last year. "We were overwhelmed and the board of directors had a tough time deciding how to distribute the funds on hand," states Cathi Bauska, secretary/treasurer. Seventeen requests were received and most asked for a large increase over last year. "It was obvious to us that we need to raise more money next year." Approximately \$14,000 will be distributed to county agencies by the end of the year.

United Way of Morrow County is in the middle of their campaign. Letters to most county businesses are going out this week. "We hope we get a good response from businesses," said Bauska, "this is a good way for

the small business to give one time to all."

United way of Morrow County is completely volunteer and raises monies from county businesses, corporations, and individuals, then distributes those funds to the agencies listed here: Heppner Mealsite senior citizens; Boardman Child Development Center; Christmas Basket Programs; Columbia River EMT Association; EMT Morrow County Ambulance; Heppner Day Care, Inc.; Lone Volunteer Fire Dept.; Irrigon Early Learning Center; Domestic Violence Services; Morrow County Neighborhood Council; Stokes Landing Senior Center; Oregon Trail Campfire; Blue Mountain Council Boy Scouts; Pioneer Memorial Hospital and Morrow County Disaster Relief Fund.

## Reading incentive program offered
