Devin threw for 250 yards on 14 of 23 passes which is a 61% completion rate and 17.9 yards per catch. Devin also had a hand in all four of our touchdowns, throwing for three and running in the last one himself. Craig caught 7 of Dicks passes for 146 yards, which is 21 yards a catch. Angell also caught two touchdown passes. He kicked

two extra points and ran in a two point conversion which was the margin of victory in our quarterfinal game with Willamina.

## Mustangs to play against Riddle in semi-finals

The Heppner Mustangs traveled to Willamina to play the Bulldogs in the quarterfinals of the State "A" playoffs. The Mustangs practiced Friday in Salem at the McKay High School to try and get used to the muddy field. This practice may have helped the Mustangs, but they were stumped in the first half of the game. Heppner started out the game by scoring first on a 27 yard pass from quarterback Dick Devin to tailback Russell Britt, but the Willamina Bulldogs come back to score on a 48 yard pass, and missed the point after to put the score at 7-6. Willamina didn't stop there as they scored two more touchdowns in the first half. The Bulldogs scored on a one yard run and a 13 yard pass, but the Heppner Mustangs came out ready to play ball in the second half as Dick Devin met senior Craig Angell on an out pattern, who turned upfield to score on a 60 yard pass play. That was just the beginning as the Mustangs mounted another long drive and scored when Devin again found Angell on a six yard pass. This score put the Mustangs in the lead 21-20, but Heppner wasn't satisfied with the score. They again found themselves in scoring position when Dick Devin kept the ball and ran it in from one yard to make the score 28-20. Willamina came back in the

fourth quarter to score on a 35 yard pass, but the run for the extra conversion was stopped by the Mustang defense to keep the score 28-26. Willamina put the pressure on the Mustang defense with about one minute left, but the Mustangs defense dug in and stopped the Willamina Bulldogs. With nine seconds left and fourth down, the Willamina field goal kicker missed a 22 yard field goal to let the Mustangs run the clock out and end the game with a score of 28-26.

Craig Angell led the Mustangs with seven catches for 146 yards followed by Russell Britt who had three catches for 39 yards. Bryan Padberg also had a big catch for 33 yards. Dick Devin threw 14 complete passes of 23 attempts for 250 yards and three touchdowns. Devin also led the Mustang defense with 20 points including one fumble recovery and 16 assisted tackles, followed by Padberg who had 16 points consisting of one interception, one unassisted tackle and 10 assisted tackles. Steve Arbogast and Britt also had 14 defensive points apiece.
