Friday, Dec. 10, the Ione Cardinals traveled to Condon to compete in the annual Christmas Tournament. Ione faced the Arlington Honkers for their first match with a win 45-44.

The shorter Honker team (average starter height of 5'8") met the taller Cardinal team (average height of 6'1"), and could hardly measure up. Ione jumped to a strong first quarter lead 18-9. Freshman Mike Garrett led with six points and had a game total of 20 points. Freshman Kyle Broderick added five points including a 3 point shot. The Cardinal defense slacked off as Arlington caught up with a half time score of Ione 25, Arlington 20.

As third quarter play opened, Ione regained consciousness and jumped to a 33-26 lead by the end of the third quarter. Dustin Padberg led with nine points ending the game with 12 total points and 10 rebounds.

The fourth quarter was the most exciting as both teams fought to advance to the championship game. Only four Cardinal players scored during the game. Jim Davison scored eight total points, four in the fourth quarter to help enable the Car-

dinals to advance in tournament play with a 45-44 win over the Honkers.
