**Irrigon special levy passes 141 to 64**

The Irrigon City Emergency Levy and temporary tax rate increase, voted on Tuesday, December 27 passed with a vote of 141 to 64. The city asked that the people pass a levy \$46,474 outside the tax base for operating purposes for 1988-89.

Due to the circumstances of no funding, the city has had to cut police services and make cuts in ci-

ty government management services and needed insurance coverages.

Based upon the last information available from the Tax Assessor, indications were that a levy rate of \$4.69 per \$1,000 was needed to operate for a full year.

A voter turnout was listed by the County Clerk as 48 percent.
