City of Irrigon to have lights

The streets of Irrigon will no longer be in the dark.

All of the city's 55 street lights were turned off and the Public Service Department laid off after a \$46,474 operating levy failed November 8 for the third time.

The \$46,474 levy was put before the voters for the fourth time December 27 and passed by a 141 to 64 vote.

Even though the city operating levy now has passed, not all of the street lights will be turned on.

"I don't visualize more than a third of them being turned back on before the third of March," said Irrigon Mayor, Don Eppenbach. "We will pick the parts of town which are more heavily populated."

The tab for Umatilla Electric turning the 50 lights back on will be \$25 per light.

The city has already made arrangements for a temporary loan to cover the added \$1,250 expense of the hook-ups, plus other expenses which have occurred due to city hall and the Public Safety department being shut down after the city operating levy failed.

Five of the lights were turned on earlier by businesses along Highway 730; Gregg's Irrigon Tavern, Inn of the Road, Brown's Auto and Truck Stop, Irrigon Market and Irrigon Stone.

The cost of the earlier hook-up and \$12 monthly charge is being shared by those businesses.

Surprisingly, crime did not rise in the town, as predicted, while the streets were in the dark and the Public Service Department was laid off.

Said Rod Collins of Rod's Market, "we had no problems at all."

"I have seen no difference," said Jean Didier of Didier's Fruit Stand.

"The only thing I've noticed," said Barbara Wadekamper, of Brown's Auto and Truck Stop along Hwy 730, "is speeding is picking up on the highway through town and people are not paying attention to stop signs."

"There has not been a big rash of crimes," said Police Chief Steve Mackey. "The big thing is the traffic violations."

The lights will be turned on, the Public Service Department will go back to work, city hall will be bustling again and things will be back to normal in the city of Irrigon after the first of the 1989 year.
