School board accepts resignations at meeting

The Morrow County School Board held a meeting February 18 at the district office in Lexington.

The board reviewed the strike notice delivered to the district on February 16.

The board approved a resolution of Contingent State of Emergency; approved a resolution restricting picketing to non-district property and approved a resolution on signs and banners.

Also approved was a resolution appropriating an additional \$1,797 in grant money to the Drug and Alcohol Prevention Fund; approved unpaid maternity leave for Lisa Sharkey from Riverside High School; unpaid medical leave for Sharon Morris from Lone Elemen-

tary; accepted resignation from Mike Royer from Heppner High School effective the end of this school year; accepted resignation from Rod Benson from Heppner, effective at end of this school year; accepted resignation of Barbara Davis as custodian from Riverside effective February 10; approved retirement of Lilly Wilson, effective June 30; and approved extended contracts for spring coaching assignments-Cathy McCabe, tennis coach, IHS; Randy Barton-assistant baseball coach Columbia Jr. High; Shelley Powell-assistant track coach at Columbia; and Rick Johnston-head baseball coach at Heppner Jr. High.

The superintendent's report included the reading of reports of accreditation for Lone, Heppner and Riverside High Schools from the

N.W. Association of Schools and Colleges; heard that four people have filed for the "at large" board position, and at least one person has filed for each of the other open positions except for positions number one and five of the Heppner-Lexington Advisory Committee.

Under new business, the board heard the first reading of a proposed policy providing a modified diploma for some Morrow County students; approved a trip to the National Youth Conference in Washington, D.C. on March 3-5 for a student and teacher from Heppner High School.

Announcements were that the O.S.B.A. spring conference will be held March 29 at the Red Lion in Pendleton.
