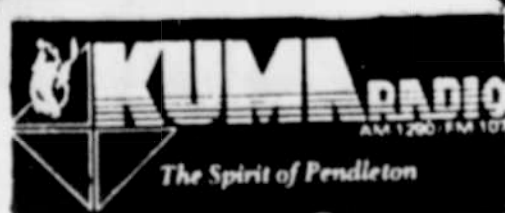

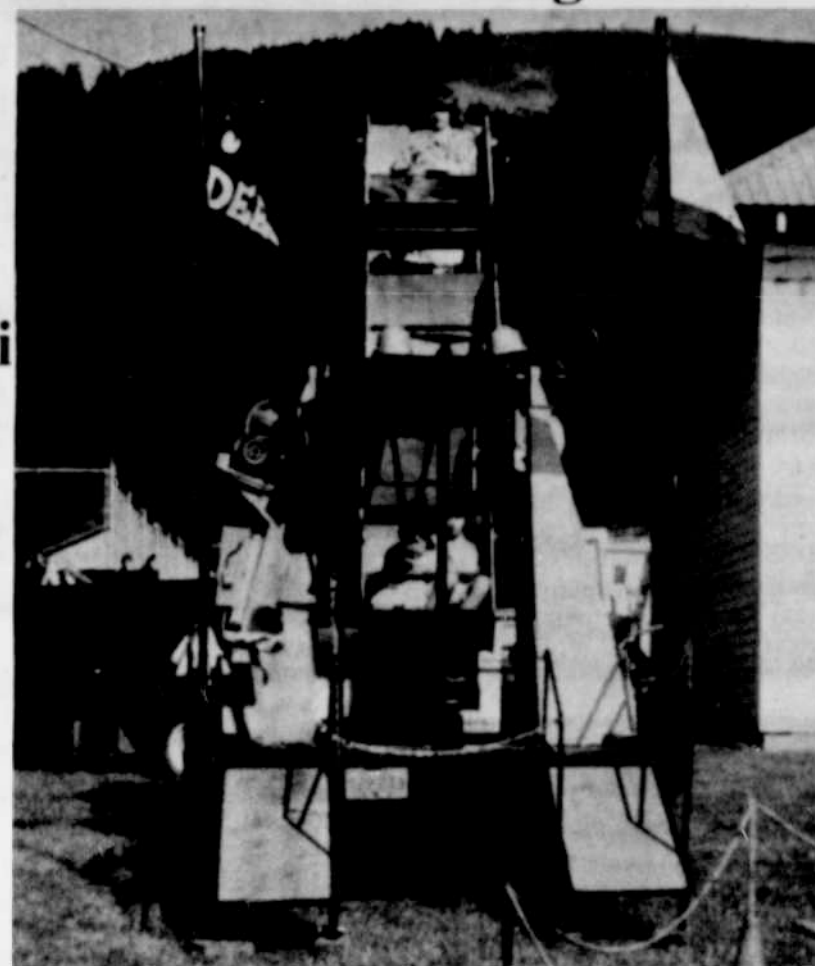


Ione Garden club learns to make potpourri

"Making Potpourri" was the program for the day presented by Birdine Tullis at the Ione Garden Club meeting March 8 at the home of Jean Nelson with Loree Hubbard acting as co-hostess. Birdine pointed out that a commercial packet of potpourri costs \$6 to \$9. Anyone with a home flower garden can make many packets for nothing more than the cost of essential oils and fixative, using flower petals, scented leaves, berries, seeds, spices or wood shavings. One merely gathers materials in dry weather, puts them on a screen tray and lets them air dry for 4 to 6 weeks. To make the potpourri one mixes the fixative (orris root-powder or gum benzoin), a few drops of essential oils and the dried material. Most recipes call for 1 oz. of fixative to 2 qts. dried material. Essential oils may be purchased from craft departments or places such as Nichols Herbs and Rare Seed catalog, Albany, Oregon.

During the business meeting the plant sale was announced for April 25 at the Ione Legion Hall. Pat Pettijohn reported that she has the book of evidence for Oregon Garden Week held last June nearly ready. It was also reported that the Woody Owl and Snokey Bear Environmental Poster contest at the Ione grade school has been judged and prizes will be presented soon. Final plans and committees were discussed for the Blue Mountain District #10 meeting at the Willows Grange Hall on April 6.
