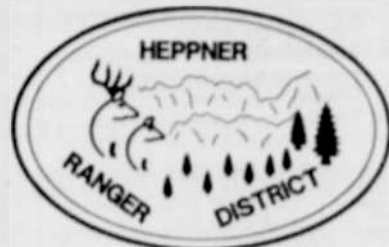
The Heppner boys golf team defeated Condon and Hermiston in a three way match on April 24. Hermiston's number one and two golfers were not available due to illness and school work.

The scores were: Heppner 316; Hermiston 320; and Condon 335. Heppner was led by Will Martin with a 77, followed by Casey Pedro

79, Rich Pettyjohn 80 and Brent Temple 80.

Medalist for the meet was Zack Palmer of Condon with a 72.

This score of 316 was 21 strokes better than their previous best. Coach Ed Hiemstra feels they are capable and will drop below 300 by district.

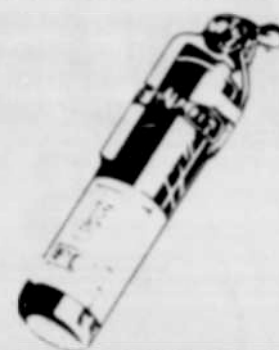

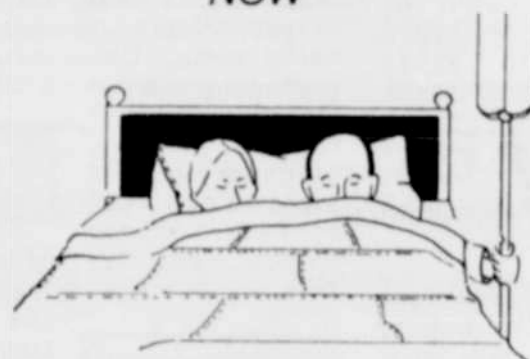
