

Country Heritage Festival is May 6-7

The 3rd annual celebration of "Our Country Heritage" festival will be held May 6 and 7 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Sherman County Historical Museum in Moro.

The Friends of the Sherman County Historical Museum have added some new events and exhibits to this year's Festival.

One new event is the Sherman County Centennial 8.9K Run which will take place Saturday, May 6 at 9:30 a.m. The runners will be transported from Moro City Hall, where registration will take place from 8-9 a.m. the morning of the

run, to the starting line of the run. The run will take place on a paved course through the wheat producing countryside east of Moro. The course is made up of gentle slopes, with one long uphill stretch. The run will end at the Moro City Hall near the site of the Country Heritage Festival. Awards and prizes will be awarded immediately after the finish of the race.

Registration fees are \$12 with a long-sleeved T-shirt or \$9 without T-shirt on registrations received before April 24. Late registrations will be \$14 with T-shirt and \$11 without T-shirt. Shirts will be available for late runners as long as supply lasts.

A new exhibit for Sunday, May 7, is the collection of porcelain dolls owned by Gwen Filbin of Dufur. Besides collecting dolls, Gwen gives lessons in her home teaching ladies to make their own keepsakes or heirloom to pass along to generations to come. Mrs. Filbin will be demonstrating some of her doll making talents at the Sherman County Museum.

The Country Craft Market also has some new vendors. Walt Mendenhall of Willamina who has done metal sculpture for 13 years will have his wheat and tree sculptures for sale. Each piece is hand made by Walt from steel, and has a natural, plated or special blown aluminum finish. All are then covered with a clear lacquer. His collection includes everything from brass-finished Christmas tree ornaments of wheat, pinecones or pinetrees to small and large wall sculptures.

Their will also be a variety of returning vendors including oil, tile and watercolor paintings, wood craft, toys, sculptures, country stitery, soft sculptures and stain glass.

As in the past there will be a wide variety of homecooked foods both days including Country Beef Stew and biscuits with pie and soft ice cream.

Raffle tickets will be sold for door prizes to be given away.

The weekend has something for all ages and is a good place to meet new and old friends. Plan to come to Moro May 6 and 7th for the "Country Heritage" Festival.

New Oregon highway Atlas available

The latest edition of the Oregon Highway Atlas is now available, according to the Oregon State Highway Division.

The 48-page publication is packed full of information for motorists using Oregon's roads and highways, according to Carol Mitchell, public information officer for the Highway Division.

"The first atlas was really popular both with Oregonians and visitors to the state, so it's been reprinted," Mitchell said. "We've updated it, corrected a few things and added some new information."

The atlas includes color photographs of several state attrac-

tions plus information on major historic sites, scenic drives, beach access and major recreation areas. Also included are detailed maps of six state regions.

"One thing that people will notice is some new photographs and better looking photographs," said Mitchell. "The printing this time produced a look that's much clearer and crisper."

The Oregon Highway Atlas and the latest official Oregon Highway Map are being distributed and are available free of charge at Highway and Motor Vehicles Division offices, Visitor Information Centers, State Police and Chambers of Commerce around the state.
