

Work begins on handicapped access at Willow Creek Dam

The project began with the collecting of signatures collected by Carl McDaniel, Jim Dunbar and Charlene Papineau, to send to the Corps asking for help in developing this area.

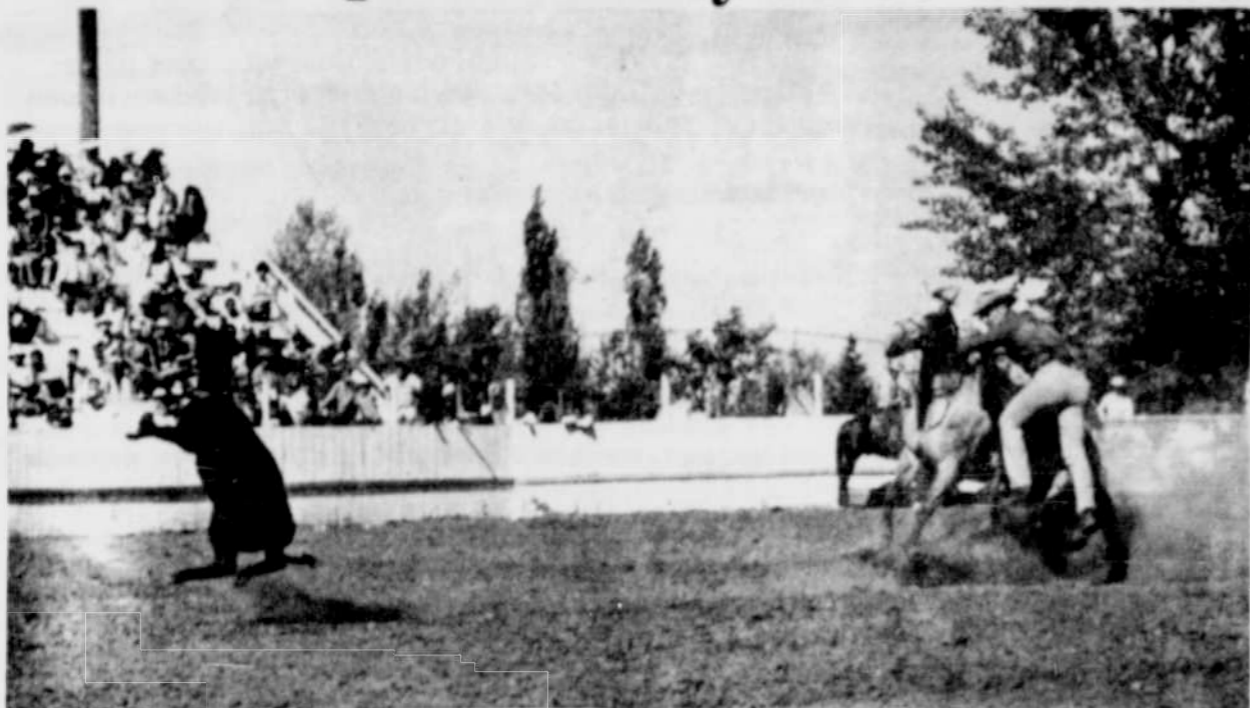
The areas have had to be fenced off to prevent four-wheelers from destroying the area, thus stopping senior citizens and handicapped from being able to get down to the water.

In talking to Charlene Papineau this week, the corps has answered their petition. The corps has indicated they would furnish supplies if the labor could be donated at this

end. A site has been selected and a large number of people have volunteered their time to take down some fencing and enlarge and improve the area selected for handicapped access.

"The corps has been very helpful" says Ms. Papineau. "Now all we need is some volunteers to make this thing go".

Other issues covered at this conference included Veterans Hospitalization, outpatient services, post-traumatic stress disorder, judicial review, and the court of veterans' appeals.
