McElligott to coordinate Bike-A-Thon

St. Jude Children's Research Hospital has announced that Loa McElligott will coordinate the St. Jude Children's Research Hospital "Wheels For Life" Bike-A-Thon May 14. Founded by Danny Thomas in 1962, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is the largest childhood cancer research-treatment-education center in America. St. Jude Hospital is non-sectarian, interracial and provides medical care for over 3,200 active patients. Currently, over \$183,000 is needed each day to keep the doors open. These funds come primarily from public contributions. The Bike-A-Thon program this year is dedicated to Brian McCollister. Brian, a native of Louisiana, was diagnosed with leukemia in October, 1984. For the next two and a half years he underwent chemotherapy. Today, Brian is in remission and visits St. Jude Hospital for routine check-ups. Brian is a living example of the progress and success of the research, patient care, and educational programs of this internationally recognized hospital. Further details concerning routes and hours will be announced later.
