Park project off to good start

Saturday, April 29, an ambitious crew of volunteers headed up by Bert Corbin gathered at Willow Creek Lake to start work on the handicap and senior citizen access project.

Several weeks ago, project "Please Don't Fence Us Out" was gathering signatures to send to the Corps of Engineers asking their assistance in this project.

Carl McDaniel, Jim Dunbar and Earl and Charlene Papineau, committee members drew up a plan and with the signatures of 200 citizens of Heppner, sent the letter to the Corps.

Terry Armentrout, Cliff Elsmore and Richard Hess of the Corp, responded immediately to the need and met with the committee to make plans to solve the problem. A plan was put into action and crews under

the direction of Ken Turner and Bert Corbin were formed and work began Saturday.

Buzz Lynch was aboard his cat and Bert Corbin was there to sign up the volunteers and get everyone lined out.

Pete Hams, Jiggs Bowman, Jack Little and Earl and Charlene, Lyle and Randy Verrall started removing fencing. They were relocated by the end of the day.

Sunday, Lynch and Stanley Cox were back on the job pushing more dirt around.

This week Gary Patterson and Don Barber of Easy Way Construction will also join the crew.

The Corps furnished the materials and the labor is volunteered for this project.

Willow Creek road almost complete

Phase two of the Willow Creek road reconstruction project should be finished by mid-July, Morrow County Judge Louis Carlson told the Heppner Chamber of Commerce Tuesday.

Carlson said paving on the portion of road from Blakes ranch to the Fay Page property should be completed

by then.

Phase three of the project, reconstruction of the road to Willow Creek Lake, should start around June 15 when bids are set to be issued. "Hopefully they will start on that by July first," Carlson said. He said the final phase should be done by May of 1990.
