Opening Little League season got underway Saturday with a double header on the new field.

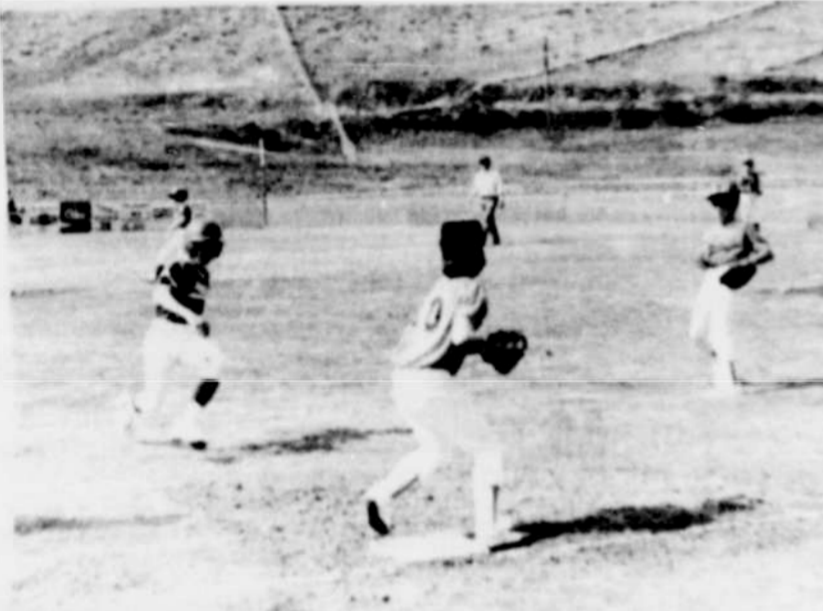

Oregon is leader in recycling

Oregon has long been a leader in recycling, dating back to 1972, when Oregon became the first state in the nation to pass a bottle bill, and today leads the country in the recycling of newspapers.

Some good reasons for the need to recycle are to save energy and natural resources, to reduce pollution, and to provide materials for new products. Many people have
