

**PUBLIC NOTICE**  
**TRUSTEE'S NOTICE OF SALE**

Reference is made to that certain trust deed made by ROBERT E. RIGGS and JAN E. Both the beneficiary and the trustee have elected to sell the said real property to satisfy the obligations secured by said trust deed and a notice of default has been recorded pursuant to Oregon Revised Statutes 86.735(3); the default for which the foreclosure is made is grantor's failure to pay when due the following sums: Monthly installments of \$617.79 each, commencing with the payment due October 1, 1988 and continuing each month until this trust deed is reinstated or goes to Trustee's sale; plus accrued late charges of \$106.68 as of January 31, 1989 and further late charges of \$17.78 on each delinquent payment thereafter; plus all fees, costs and expenses associated with this foreclosure, all sums expended by beneficiary to protect the property or its interest therein during the pendency of this proceeding, evidence that taxes are paid as provided by the terms of the Trust Deed, and plus the deficit reserve account balance of \$41.70.

**Cecil M. Stefani**

Recitation of the rosary for Cecil Stefani was held Sunday at the St. William Catholic Church in Ione. Mass was held Monday at St. William's. Concluding service and burial was at High View Cemetery in Ione.

Mrs. Stefani, 82, of Ione, died Thursday, May 18, 1989 at Pioneer Memorial Hospital in Heppner. She was born March 16, 1907, at Gooseberry, near Ione, daughter of Tillman and Nora Brannon Hogue.

On June 1, 1925, she married Arthur E. Stefani at Vancouver, Wash. They lived in the Willamette Valley until 1930 when they moved to Ione and started the Owl Trucking Line which hauled wheat and cattle, then farmed in the Ione area for more than 40 years. The couple also owned and operated Stefani's Fine Food restaurant at Ione for six years. Mrs. Stefani drove a mail route for many years.

She was a member of the Willows Grange in Ione and St. William Catholic Church.

Survivors include a son, Arthur A., four grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. Stefani died in 1978 and a brother and sister also died earlier.
