For the second time in the past three years, the Boeing Company has contributed funds to purchase communications equipment for local firefighting and emergency services volunteers.

Rob Brown, site manager of Boeing Agri-Industrial Co., a Boeing subsidiary located in Boardman, and Lt. Sam Edwards, chief of security and fire protection at the company's

Boardman Antenna Test Range, presented a check for \$1,295 to Jeff McCauley, representing the Boardman Firefighters Assn. The presentation took place Tuesday, May 23 at the new Boardman ambulance garage and EMT headquarters.

Brown added that the need for improved communications equipment is even greater this year since the number of volunteer firefighters and EMTs has declined. Cheryl Ammons, head EMT of the Columbia River EMT Assn. said additional volunteers are needed to join the 14 firefighters and five EMTs that currently serve the Boardman community.

While the 1987 corporate contribution was used to purchase pagers for the volunteer firefighters, McCauley indicated that this year's contribution will be used to purchase additional communications equipment for the EMTs.
