School board met at RHS May 15

The Morrow County School Board met Monday, May 15 at Riverside High School.

From the consent agenda: the board approved a certificate for Joe Stevens in appreciation of his service; accepted the resignation of Dave Presley from his position as head football coach at Lone High School; and accepted the resignation of Bob Bass from his position as custodian at Sam Boardman Elementary School.

Shane Fritz, RHS, gave a curriculum report on the Japanese language program at Eastern Oregon State College and its advantages to the district.

The board heard a request from Rev. Richard Eggen, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Boardman, to refrain from scheduling school events on Wednesday evenings.

The superintendent reported that Heppner Elementary School requested and received approval to change a field trip from Bend to the "Say No To Drugs" rally in Salem. A notice was read from Barbara Bloodsworth, County Clerk, declaring the June 27 election a walk-in election.

Under unfinished business, the board approved action to provide a Migrant Education Program in the

1989-90 school year; approved a \$525 donation from Boardman Farms to fund the Migrant Education program for the remainder of the school year; appointed Peggy Fishburn to serve on the Heppner-Lexington Advisory Committee, position no. 5; and approved M.C.E.A.'s request for language changes in the contract with the stipulation that pending legal actions and requests be dropped.

New business included the approval of hiring all recommended classified, supervisory and confidential employees; removed consideration of the classified employees' contract from the agenda; approved a request from the Fair Board for the shuttle bus and parking area during the fair; approved a field trip to the coast for Lone High School seniors, they will pay all the costs; approved a field trip for Riverside High School swing choir to attend a festival in Gresham; approved hiring S.C.M. Consultants, Inc., as project designers for asbestos removal in the district; accepted the bids on surplus property and approved purchasing a handicapped student bus.

The district received an excellent report from the State standardization team with some recommendations and approved editorial changes in the district's Affirmative Action policy.

Repair work being done on Western Route Road

Forest Service Road 53, locally known as the Western Route, is in the process of being partially reconstructed and paved, according to Earle Rother, Public Affairs Specialist for the Umatilla National Forest. Approximately 22 miles of road, from the junction of Highway 395 near Ukiah to the junction of Forest Road 21, will be affected. Motorists can expect 15-minute delays and should be aware that construction may take place on the weekends. "A major part of the reconstruction is to straighten out the

slow curve near Milepost 24," Rother states.

Work on the Western Route is scheduled to be completed near the end of August.
