**Chinese Evangelist shares
story of Life in China**

"The same curiosity that has Americans lining up to see 'The Last Emperor' and 'Empire of the Sun' brings them to hear my story," says inspirational author and speaker Nora Lam. Native of Shanghai and now a U.S. citizen, Lam sees herself as an ambassador of understanding and love to both American and the Orient.

As part of a banquet tour of key U.S. cities, Lam speaks July 8 at the Morrow County Fairgrounds. The program includes a look at Lam's popular "Love China" Mission Tours that have taken over 4,100 Americans to the Far East. She also shares highlights from her life story and ministers spiritually.

Adopted into a wealthy Shanghai family, Nora Lam's early childhood

was relatively carefree and secure. That prosperity was brutally swept away during the WW II Japanese occupation, briefly regained, and then completely destroyed in the Communist Revolution. A young university law professor, Lam was imprisoned, beaten and escaped a firing squad to safety in Hong Kong.

Nora Lam's story was recently approved by Central China Television for release as a mini-series in Mainland China.

Lam hosts an inspirational Chinese talk show aired in Taiwan and is a popular speaker throughout the Far East. As a goodwill ambassador, she frequently meets with heads of state and key church leaders on both sides of the Pacific.
