The board heard a report on the recruitment and replacement of budgeted administrative staff and agreed to designate a screening committee composed of two advisory committee members and two administrators to select principal candidates for HHS. The finalists will be interviewed by the board.

Under new business, the board accepted Chuck Starr's resignation from position as Assistant Superintendent; approved Jim Bier's retirement from position as high school principal; approved Lib Daggett's retirement from the position as Heppner High School secretary; approved hiring Ron Beemer as assistant custodian at SBE; heard a report on the reduction of staff at HHS; approved applying for a waiver for state requirement of 175 days of instruction for 1988-89 school year; approved a resolution appropriating funds from a career guidance grant at RHS; appointed Doug Trudeau to Boardman-Irrigon Advisory committee replacing Alan Holmes.

Resolutions adopting the 1989-90 budget, making appropriations for the 1989-90 budget, establishing the 1989-90 debt service and establishing the anticipated ad valorem tax levy for 1989-90. It was decided to go forward on budgeted computer equipment lease/purchase plans for 1989-90, if the June 27 vote is approved.

Extended responsibility contract were approved as recommended at HHS, RHS, IHS, CJH, ACH, and SBE with the exception of Lea Calvert, assistant volleyball coach and Phyllis Payne, head track coach at HJHS.

The board approved a 3 percent salary increase for confidential employees.
