## Wedding Bells, Marriage and Money

Money, a part of every marriage, should be managed in such a way that it enhances, rather than hinders, the relationship.

If you're planning to marry, or are recently married, discuss money with your partner. Discuss how much income you have, your spending priorities, and how money is to be handled.

There is no one way to handle money in a marriage. Some couples pool all their income and share all expenses. Some couples pool some money for shared expenses and goals, and each spouse keeps some money separate for individual expenses and goals. And some couples keep all their income separate and negotiate who pays which expenses.

How the partners feel about how the money is managed is important. Does the way the money is managed enhance the relationship? Does it make each person feel valued?

When a couple marries, each brings to the marriage attitudes, values, and feelings about money. The attitudes, values, and feelings of

the wife and husband may differ. It takes time, effort, and communication to arrive at a common understanding.

When a couple marries often one or both brings to the marriage debts, child support obligations and property. It is important to talk about these - are these debts and property brought into the marriage to become debts and property of the couple, or are they to be separate debts and property of the individual?

Talking about money may seem unromantic. But, right from the start money is part of your relationship. Discussing money issues will help you develop a system of handling money that enhances your relationship.
