## Evans selected to serve Oregon Beef Council

Heppner rancher Wayne Evans has been elected vice chairman of the Oregon Beef Council, the promotional arm of the state's beef industry.

Elected Council chairman was Arthur "Butch" Van Veldhuizen, a Turner dairyman, and treasurer is Sue Cauble of Eagle Point. Each will serve through June 30, 1990.

Evans, a native of Heppner who was graduated from Heppner High School, graduated from Oregon State University in 1969. He has been active in several industry organizations, serving as president

of the Morrow County Livestock Growers, as a vice president of the Oregon Cattlemen's Association and a member of the Oregon Beef Council for two years. He is a member of the Morrow County Rodeo Board, served as chairman of the County Weed District and is a member of the Oregon Wheat Growers League.

Evans and his wife, Susan, own Evans Ranches, a cattle and wheat operation. They are the parents of one daughter, Kelsie, age 12.

Van Veldhuizen has a 200 acre dairy southeast of Salem and has

been a member of the Council for three years. He also serves on the board of the Oregon Dairy Association. He was named "Businessman of the Year" in 1988 for Turner and surrounding communities.

Council members, during their annual meeting in Enterprise, also approved a budget of \$558,966 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990. Funds, which are generated by "checkoff" dollars from the sale of cattle, will be used for research, education and promotion of beef in Oregon.

## Devin to play on Shrine team

On August 2nd the top sixty (60) AA, A, & B football players of the class of 1989 will report, in Portland for the Thirty-Seventh Annual East West Shrine Football game. The players and their families will join the East-West coaches, and East-West Executive Committee for lunch and a tour of the Portland Unit Shrine Hospital for Crippled Children. This gives the team members, their parents, and the coaches a chance to see the real purpose of the East-West Shrine Game.

Wednesday afternoon the teams will be bussed to their training camp at Eastern Oregon State College in LaGrande. That evening the teams will be taking physicals and having "chalk talks" with their coaching staffs.

Thursday starts nine days of intense preparation for the big game at Baker's High School Stadium. A great deal must be learned in a short period of time. Players from high school football programs all over the state must learn common terminology, new plays, and new offensive and defensive signals and sets. They also must learn to work with new teammates they have just

met to form solid football teams. Sunday, August 6, the teams will enjoy a barbecue and swim party at LaGrande, organized by the Union County Shrine Club.

By the time Saturday, August 12 rolls around, East coaches, Bruce Resse of North Valley high school, Grants Pass; Dave De Forest of LaPine high school and Richard Thew of Cove high school along with West coaches Ed Drew of Hood River and Dewey Sullivan of Dayton and Ed McDaniel of Paisley high schools, will have molded these two groups of all-stars into two fine football teams.

## 1st Interstate to sell state fair tickets
