As the 1989 County Fair approaches, please think for a minute about some of the goals of a fair. County Fair is an educational experience for everyone involved. It offers project members and adult leaders an opportunity to develop leadership skills as they participate in various activities. As members prepare for the Fair, they have a chance to gain knowledge and skills through activities and project meetings. 4-H members also learn to make decisions and relate to others. 4-H'ers decide which of their projects will be exhibited and which activities to participate in at Fair. Second year for team branding

The Morrow County Rodeo Board is sponsoring the annual Team Branding again this year.

The rules of Team Branding includes a team of four members with four cattle. There are two that will try to head and heel the cattle and two people working on the ground. They are assigned an area which they are to brand (with paint) the cattle. Failure to do so will result in a time penalty. Teams are limited to six minutes to do all four cattle. After the first two are roped and branded, the people on the ground switch and try their turns at roping and the other two work the ground. The cattle must be roped with a clean head and heel catch. Excessive choking of the animal results in a disqualification of the team.

The fastest team to brand all the cattle, bring home the paycheck.

The branding will be held at the fairgrounds on Thursday, August 17. Sign-up will be from 6 p.m. until the roping starts at 7 p.m. Entry fee is \$10 per man or \$40 per team.
