These delicious meat skewers are prepared from a recipe developed by the Oregon Beef Council and approved by the American Heart Association. The Thai Ribbons are made from flank or round steak cuts which are less expensive parts of the beef. They are cut in strips and marinated, then broiled.

The Morrow County CattleWomen have had great success in serving these, both at the Governor's Conference in Pendleton and during the Heppner St. Patrick's Day Celebration.

The CattleWomen are gearing up for the National Beef Cook-Off, September 17-19 in Portland. Several local members will attend the cook-off assisting in many areas and organizing the trade show.
