### Road Report

The reconstruction of Phase II on the Willow Creek Road of 5.9 miles has been completed. Phase III reconstruction of 4.8 miles is to be completed the summer of 1990. This will complete the 18.3 miles of reconstruction on this road.

This summer the county crusher has been located on Skinner Creek crushing rock for the reconstruction

of Phase II and Phase III on the Willow Creek Road. It is anticipated this operation will be completed in approximately two weeks and the crusher will move to Sandhollow to begin crushing rock for county projects and roads.

The month of July has found county crews busy chip sealing and paving county roads.

Stockpiling and chip sealing was done on the following roads: East Baseline, 5.8 miles; Little Butter Creek, 6 miles; Juniper Road, 7 miles, for a total of 18.8 miles to date.

Two and eight-tenths of Kilkenny Road was blade patched with a two inch, twenty-two foot wide overlay applied and completed.

Patching of potholes continued through the month of July on a number of county roads in both the Irrigon-Boardman area, as well as the south end of the county.

Various road maintenance was done by graveling dust holes on gravel roads, cleaning of barrow pits on Bombing Range and Lexington Cemetery roads, chip sealing the parking lot at Pioneer Memorial Hospital and blading of gravel roads in Irrigon.

The county shop has been busy taking care of routine maintenance problems in the daily usage of county equipment.
