Descendants of William Stange Wilson early day pioneer, Indian scout and wagonmaster gathered at the Irrigon Marina Park August 19. The 4th biannual reunion was initiated by the children of Edwin Wilson, who was a resident of Irrigon and died there in 1932. Of his nine children, the five still living were present coming from California, Oregon and Washington. Five generations were represented with some coming from Idaho and Utah. Additional members of the family have been located since the 1987 reunion belonging to W.S. Wilson's son Henry's family. Several had written historical accounts of early day happenings which were circulated among those present. One of

them told of William Stange Wilson finding the body of Grimes, an early day miner, who had been murdered. Grimes was the leader of the party that discovered gold in the Bogus Basin area north of Boise. Present day Grimes Pass was named for him. Anyone wishing more information may call Chester A.
