## Interest to increase on delinquent taxes

The Department of Revenue announces that the interest rate on delinquent property taxes paid on or

after October 3, 1989 will be calculated at the new rate of 16 percent (1-1/2 percent per month). The new rate will apply for the interest that accrues from July 16, 1989 to the date of payment.

The interest rate on any delinquent taxes paid before October 3, will remain at the current rate of 12 percent (1 percent per month).

The increase in interest does not apply to interest accumulated before July 16, 1989. For example, if a taxpayer has delinquent property taxes for the 1987-88 tax year and does not pay the tax before October 3, 1989, the interest charged on the outstanding amount before July 16, 1989 is at 12 percent. The interest charged for the period beginning July 16, 1989 will be at 16 percent.

The interest rate increase is one provision of a measure passed by the 1989 legislature.
