

Heppner dominates Stanfield 48-6

The Stanfield Tigers traveled to Heppner Friday, Oct. 6 to play the two and one Heppner Mustangs. Heppner came away with a 48-6 victory.

The Mustangs kicked off to the Tigers, and three plays later the Mustang offense took over. The Mustangs wasted little time scoring, when Mustang fullback Doug Devin scored the games first touchdown from nine yards out. Rick Osmin's kick made the score 7-0.

The Tigers then got the ball and drove it down into Mustang territory. The Tigers were threatening

half the Tigers got the ball and threw another interception, this time to Bob Krein. The next play the Mustangs scored again when Britt hit Casey Pedro on a 50 yard touchdown reception. Britt added the two point conversion giving the Mustangs a 27 to 0 halftime lead.

To start the third quarter, the Stanfield Tigers kicked off to the Mustangs. The Mustangs Krein then scored his second touchdown of the night, this time from 39 yards out. Osmin's kick gave the Mustangs a 34-0 lead.

The Tigers struck next for their only score of the game. Stanfield Brian Bailey ran it in from 22 yards. The extra point attempt was blocked by Britt making the score, Mustangs 34, Stanfield 6.

Heppner wasn't done yet. Rick Osmin also reached the end zone from 45 yards out and his extra point attempt was good making the score 41 to 6.

The Mustangs last score came when sophomore Jason Britt punched it in from one yard out and Osmin's kick was good making the final score 48-6. The Mustangs next game will be Thursday, Oct. 12, against the 3 and 0 Riverside Pirates at Boardman.
