Bert E. Corbin

A memorial service for Bert E. Corbin was held at the Heppner Elks Temple on Saturday, Oct. 21.

Mr. Corbin, 76, Heppner, died Wednesday, Oct. 18, 1989 at Pioneer Memorial Hospital in Heppner.

He was born June 10, 1913, at Strong City, Kan. to Morgan and Nellie Reddick Corbin.

He came to Heppner in 1931 and in 1937 married Genevieve Hanna in Pendleton.

Mr. Corbin was involved in construction work and logging and worked for Morrow County Grain Growers for 10 years. He was a special deputy for three years and served with the Heppner City Police for nine years. He had studied criminal law at Blue Mountain Community College. He was actively involved with the Willow Creek Park District and was involved in community affairs.

He was a member of the Heppner BPOE 358. He coached Little League and junior bowlers.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN

that sealed bids will be received on behalf of the City of Heppner, Morrow County, Oregon (the "City"), for the purchase of its General Obligation Sewer Bonds, Series 1989 (the "Bonds"), until 11:00 o'clock a.m. (Pacific Time) on Thursday, November 9, 1989, at the offices of Lindsay, Hart, Neil & Weigler, Lawyers, Suite 1800, 222 S.W. Columbia Street, Portland, Oregon 97201-6618, at which time they will be publicly opened and announced.

The bids shall be considered and acted upon by the City within four hours.

ISSUE: The issue shall be in the aggregate principal amount of SIX HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$625,000), consisting of registered Bonds in denominations of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) or integral multiples thereof, all dated November 1, 1989.

INTEREST AND BIDDING CONSTRAINTS: Interest is payable semiannually on April 1 and October 1 of each year until maturity or prior redemption, commencing April 1, 1990. Bidders must specify the interest rate or rates which the Bonds hereby offered for sale shall bear.

The bids shall comply with the following conditions: (1) the maximum interest rate shall not exceed a true interest cost of ten percent (10%) per annum (2) each interest rate specified in any bid must be a multiple of 1/8th or 1/20th of one percent (1%); (3) no Bond shall bear more than one rate of interest; (4) each Bond shall bear interest from its date to its stated maturity date at the interest rate specified in the bid; (5) all Bonds maturing at any one time shall bear the same rate of interest; and (6) the interest rate named for the Bonds of any maturity shall not be less than the rate of interest named for the Bonds of an earlier maturity.

REGISTRATION: The Bonds will be issued in fully registered form, and may be exchanged at the expense of the City for similar Bonds of different authorized denominations. Bonds may not be converted to bearer form.

OPTIONAL REDEMPTION: The City reserves the right to redeem all or any portion of the Bonds maturing after October 1, 1997, in inverse order of maturity and by lot within a maturity on October 1, 1997, and on any interest payment date thereafter, at par plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

Notice of any call for redemption, unless waived by the owners of the Bonds to be redeemed, shall be mailed not less than thirty days and not more than sixty days prior to such call to the registered owners of the Bonds, and otherwise given as required by the authorizing Bond resolution and by law; however, any failure to give notice shall not invalidate the redemption of the Bonds. All Bonds called for redemption shall cease to bear interest from the date designated in the notice.

PAYMENT: Principal and interest are payable, either at maturity or upon earlier redemption, by check or draft through the principal corporate trust office of the registrar and paying agent of the City, which shall be a bank in Portland, Oregon.

PURPOSE: The Bonds are being issued to finance, in part, sewer improvements and to pay all costs incidental thereto. The Bonds were authorized at a special election held within the City on May 16, 1989.

SECURITY: The Bonds are general obligations of the City. The City has covenanted to levy an ad valorem tax annually which, with other available funds, will be sufficient to pay Bond principal and interest as they come due.

LEGAL OPINION: The approving opinion of Lindsay, Hart, Neil & Weigler, Lawyers, of Portland, Oregon, will be provided at no cost to the purchaser, and will be printed on the Bonds at the expense of the City.

TAX EXEMPT STATUS: In the opinion of Bond Counsel, under existing law and conditioned on the City complying with certain covenants relating to the tax-exempt status of the Bonds, interest on the Bonds is excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes (except for certain taxes on corporations). The Bonds are not "private activity bonds" under Section 141 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code").

In the opinion of Bond Counsel, the interest on the Bonds is exempt from personal income taxation by the State of Oregon under present state law.

Bond Counsel expresses no opinion regarding other federal or state tax consequences arising with respect to the Bonds.

The City has the legal authority to comply with its covenants.

BANK PURCHASE: The City has designated the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

BEST BID: The Bonds will be awarded to the responsible bidder whose proposal will result in the lowest true interest cost to the City. True interest cost will be determined by doubling the semiannual interest rate necessary to discount the debt service to November 1, 1989, and the price bid for the Bonds. Each bidder is requested to supply the total interest cost and the true interest cost that the City will pay upon the issue if the bid is accepted. The purchaser must pay accrued interest, computed on a 360-day basis, from the date of the Bonds to the date of delivery. The cost of printing the Bonds will be paid by the City.

CERTIFICATE OF REOFFERING PRICE: The successful bidder shall provide to Bond Counsel and the City's financial advisor not less than three business days prior to closing a certificate stating that the successful bidder: (1) shall offer all Bonds in each maturity for sale to the general public at a price no greater than the certified reoffering price until at least ten percent of the principal amount of each maturity is sold at a price less than or equal to the certified reoffering price; or (2) has purchased the Bonds for its own portfolio without intention to resell the Bonds; or (3) has made a bona fide private placement of the Bonds and the terms of such private placement. Failure to honor this agreement may result in cancellation of the sale and forfeiture of the successful bidder's good faith deposit.

DELIVERY: Delivery of the Bonds will be made without cost to the successful bidder at such bank in the City of Portland, Oregon, as the successful bidder shall name, or elsewhere at the expense of the successful bidder. Payment for the Bonds must be made in federal funds. Delivery of the Bonds will be made within thirty days.

FORM OF BID: All bids must be for not less than all the bonds hereby offered for sale, and for not less than ninety-seven percent (97%) of the par value thereof and accrued interest to the date of delivery. Each bid together with bidder's check as herein specified must be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the City and designated "Proposal for Bonds."

BID CHECK: All bids must be unconditional and accompanied by a certified or cashier's check on a bank doing business in the State of Oregon for TWELVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$12,500) payable to the order of the City to secure the City from any loss resulting from the failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of its bid. Checks will be forfeited to the City as liquidated damages in case the bidder to whom the Bonds are awarded withdraws its bid or fails to complete its purchase in accordance with the terms thereof.
