## Flores-Rio sentenced

A man was sentenced November 8 following his convictions on attempted burglary charges in Morrow County Circuit Court, said Morrow Co. District Attorney, Jeff Wallace.

Jesus Flores-Rios, 36, Mexico, was convicted last summer following a judge trial on two counts of second-degree attempted burglary. The convictions arose from July, 1986 break-ins at the U.S. Post Office and the Turner-VanMarter & Bryant Insurance agency in Heppner. Flores-Rios later fled the area and was serving a prison sentence on a Wasco County burglary conviction when he was convicted on the Morrow County charges.

Circuit Judge Pro-Tem James Donnell sentenced Flores-Rios to one year in the Morrow County Jail, and suspended the execution of sentence. He placed him on five years probation, and ordered him turned over to immigration authorities for deportation to Mexico.

He was further ordered not to return to the U.S. during the term of his probation.

## Grant Union ends Riverside season

The Prospectors rallied in the second half, driving 75 yards for a touchdown in 10 plays and two minutes. Two interceptions by the Prospectors in the closing minutes gave them the step above the Pirates.

The Pirates took the lead on the final play of the first half. Looking to run out the clock and finish the half with the lead, Grant Union

downed the ball on third down and punted with less than 30 seconds left.

Riverside quarterback Jeremy Tovey hit Matt Andreason with a pass to the Prospectors' 24 yard line, setting up a 41-yard field goal by Pirate kicker Jeff Moody.

The Pirates started the third quarter leading 9-8. Each team managed only one first down with both defenses controlling the third quarter.

Riverside, the Columbia Basin Conference champion, ends its

season with a 9-1 record.
