## Students compete in Knowledge Master Open

Wednesday, December 6, eleven students from Columbia Junior High School in Irrigon participated in the Knowledge Master Open. In the contest, over 34,000 students answered 200 questions programmed for Apple II computers in the United States, Canada and other parts of the globe. This is the third time Columbia students have entered the contest.

The students were selected by their teachers for academic excellence in one or more of the question areas included on the quiz.

December is "Drinking and Drugged Driving Awareness Month" in Oregon, according to Morrow County District Attorney Jeff Wallace.

The week of December 10-16 has also been designated as "National Drunk and Drugged Driving Awareness Week."

"Each year 300 Oregonians are killed and 10,000 more seriously injured because of drinking drivers," says Wallace. "During the holiday season, we need to be aware of the problems which drinking and driving can cause."

Throughout the holiday season, Mothers Against Drunk Driving

(MADD) and the Oregon Tow Truck Association (OTTA) will sponsor the "Oregon Life Tow" program. Through this program, persons who feel they may have had too much to drink to drive home safely can call for a tow truck. The tow truck will take both driver and the vehicle home. The program is offered statewide 24-hours a day through New Years. The service is free and the number to call for a ride is 1-800-243-4450.

"The penalties for drunk driving in Oregon are stiff," says Wallace. "They include a mandatory two days in jail on a first conviction, fines up to \$2,500, attorneys fees and other

mandatory assessments. Your insurance can also be affected and your license will be suspended for a year, minimum."

"Under Oregon law, a blood alcohol content of .08 or higher is considered under the influence," says Wallace. "And even a lower alcohol content can affect your judgment and reflexes."

"Many families have been victimized by accidents involving drunk drivers, including mine," says Wallace. "and the prosecution of drunk driving is a high priority with district attorneys nationwide. If you're going to drink, don't drive."
