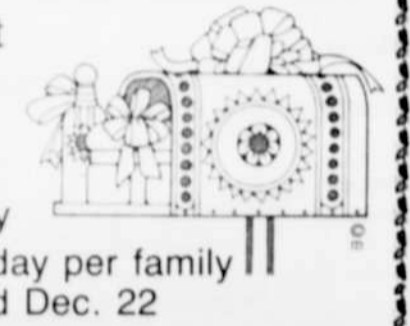
Pioneers slide by Lady Pirates
