

Fillies place second in Mac-Hi tournament

The Heppner Fillies traveled to Milton-Freewater last weekend to play in Mac-Hi's "I'll Be Home For Christmas Tournament". The Fillies placed second in the tournament by beating Mac-Hi Friday and losing to West Valley (Yakima) on Saturday. The Fillies opened the tournament by beating the host Pioneers, 48 to 36. Heppner took advantage of 45 Pioneer turnovers to get the victory. The Fillies jumped out early in the game to build a nine-point lead at the end of the first quarter. Jennifer Currin scored five points in the quarter while Heppner's defense held Mac-Hi to only a single basket. Behind six points from Nikki Brisbois the Fillies continued to build on their lead in the second quarter. Heppner took a 24-12 advantage into the locker room. Heppner continued its dominance in the third period as the Fillies stret-

ched their lead to 20. Jennifer Currin scored 10 points in the quarter. Mac-Hi cut into Heppner's lead in the final stanza but couldn't overcome the Fillies and Heppner went on to a 48-36 victory. Currin scored 17 points to lead the Fillies, dished out six assists and ripped down seven rebounds. Nikki Brisbois added 13 for the victorious Fillies. The Fillies faced West Valley in the championship round of the Mac-Hi Tournament. West Valley advanced to the championship game by beating the Riverside Pirates 42-32. A slow start by the Fillies hurt their chances as they fell behind, 18-8, at the end of the first period to a much taller West Valley team. West Valley started a tall trio led by 6' Christine Sivernail. Heppner couldn't cut into West Valley's lead in a low scoring second quarter. Each team only scored six

points as the Fillies trailed 24-14 at the half. West Valley extended their lead in the third period as they outscored the Fillies, 13-6. Heppner went into the final period trailing, 37-20. The Fillies cut into West Valley's lead in the fourth quarter but lost by 12 points, 49-34. Dulcie Palmer led the Fillies in scoring with 10 points. Jennifer Currin, who was named to the All-Tournament team, scored eight points and yanked down nine rebounds. Coach Mark Dowdy said the tournament was a good experience for the Fillies. "I thought it was a good tournament for us. Each game presented us with some excellent opportunities to get ready for league. Playing West Valley was good for us because we won't see a team that tall again all year long. I thought we held our own with their height, given the situation," stated Dowdy.
