Heppner player leads in George Fox games

For the first time in recent George Fox College history, the Lady Bruin basketball squad held Concordia College to 63 points, and a Heppner player Missy Eubanks, assisted in the game, Dec. 4 in Portland. George Fox used a tenacious defense to keep NAIA District 2's top team within striking distance. However, icecold shooting by the Lady Bruins gave the Cavaliers a 63-47 victory.

On Saturday, Dec. 2, George Fox beat Oregon Tech in the championship game in Yamhill County to win the tournament.

The Lady Bruins led by more than 30 points at times on their way to a 70-49 win that gave them the tourney crown.

The Lady Bruins reached the championship game with a 64-52 Friday night win over Lewis and Clark. The double-victory weekend leaves GFC women atop NAIA District 2 with a 3-0 standing and 14 power points in the ratings.

The championship game was a classic battle of height versus speed. Oregon Tech's roster boasts a 6-0 center and two 5-11 forwards. GFC's tallest player is a 5-10 freshman. In the end, though, it was the shorter, scrappier Lady Bruins who won the tourney title.

Defense was the key to the game with George Fox outrebounded by six, 51-45.

George Fox had four in double-figure scoring. Junior forward, Missy Eubanks led the team with 15 points, seven rebounds and four steals.
