

Forest closed to attract deer, elk to feeding site

The 25,000-acre fenced area of the Starkey Experimental Forest and Range, southwest of LaGrande, has been temporarily closed to the public until early spring in 1990.

The annual, winter closure will allow researchers to bait deer and elk into the winter feeding site within the closure. "In order to attract deer and elk to the winter feeding site, we are setting out alfalfa hay and pellets along all major roads throughout the study area," Larry Bryant, wildlife biologist for the USDA Forest Service, said.

"We are asking the public to cooperate and remain out of the area so that animals can find and readily use the bait along the roads, thus ensuring that animals move to the winter site as quickly as possible," Bryant said.

Once deer and elk are baited into the winter feeding site, their physical condition and reproductive status will be checked. Some animals will be fitted with radio collars or ear-tagged for identification.

The animals will be released back into the main study area in early spring, 1990. The enclosure will reopen to the public at that time.

The closed research area, 28 miles southwest of LaGrande on the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest, is surrounded by an 8-foot-high deer- and elk-proof fence that was constructed during 1987 as part of the cooperative research effort between the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and the USDA Forest Service.

The outcome of the 10-year study will effect the way the national forests are managed in the future. Closures and restrictions are necessary to ensure a successful and credible study, according to Bryant.

Forest Supervisor Bob Richmond reminds recreationists that the Starkey research area is permanently closed to snowmobiles. The boundary of the snowmobile closure includes all area inside the fence and a small area between the fence and highway 244. Signs have been posted along the fence and the highway.

Also the 12 foot wide right-of-way along both sides of the fence line is closed permanently to all motorized vehicles.

New law gives car insurance discount

As the New Year rings in, older motorists will have an incentive to refresh their driving skills. A new law which took effect January 1 requires all auto insurance companies in the state to give insurance premium discounts to drivers who successfully complete a state approved driver education course.

Bob Mackey, statewide coordinator of the 55/Alive Mature Driving Program for the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP), said, "in order to take advantage of the auto insurance discounts, drivers 55 and older must complete a driver education course every three years and those 70 and older must take the course every two years."

Mackey said the aging process can slow reaction time, narrow peripheral vision and cause hearing loss and these factors can cause accidents among older motorists. An eight-hour classroom course taught by AARP alerts older drivers about how the aging process affects driving and reviews ways to cope with traffic hazards and adverse driving conditions.

Because of the new law, Mackey said AARP's 55/Alive Mature Driving courses are expected to double the number of course graduates in 1990 to 15,000 from 7,500. Mackey said there are 750 licensed auto insurance companies in the state and that until now only a handful of insurance companies have provided auto insurance discounts to older drivers.

AARP is the nation's largest organization of Americans 50 and older. The nonprofit, nonpartisan organization offers a wide variety of membership benefits, legislative representation at federal and state levels, and educational and community service programs carried out through a national network of volunteers and local chapters. The association, based in Washington D.C. with a Northwest regional office in Seattle, also offers a variety of educational and advocacy programs for older workers, who make up one-third of AARP's total membership.
