Lowell Turner, a 1956 graduate of Heppner High School, pilot for American Airlines since 1966, recently checked out as captain on

the A-300 AIRBUS. American has 23 airbuses and 12 more on order. American purchased the newest high-tech twin jumbo jet, international model, which carries 267

passengers and a crew of 10. The fuel capacity is over 120,000 pounds, and it cruises at 8 mach. It weighs in at 380,000 pounds and is powered by two G.E. 61,500 pound thrust engines. The airbus is made in France with a consortium of engineering from Great Britain, France, Germany and Spain.

Lowell and wife Mary, while based in Miami, flew mostly through the Caribbean.

Lowell is now in school to earn an F.A.A. rating on the Boeing 767-757, which are made in Washington. School takes about six weeks and will increase to Lowell's collection of ratings to five. Lowell's next base with American will be San Diego.
