The freshmen traveled to Condon for a rematch with Condon's JV team, who had beaten the Mustangs once already. But it just wasn't to be as Heppner couldn't get their game going early, and Condon did, taking a 35-25 halftime lead.

As the second half started the Mustangs came charging back to pull within two points at 43-41, but Condon stayed in control and pulled away for the win. Shawn Greenfield of Condon led all scorers with 26 points, as Scott Coe led Heppner with 20.

Tony Burt led all scorers with 15 points and Shane Munkers had 14. None of Pilot Rock's players scored in double figures.
